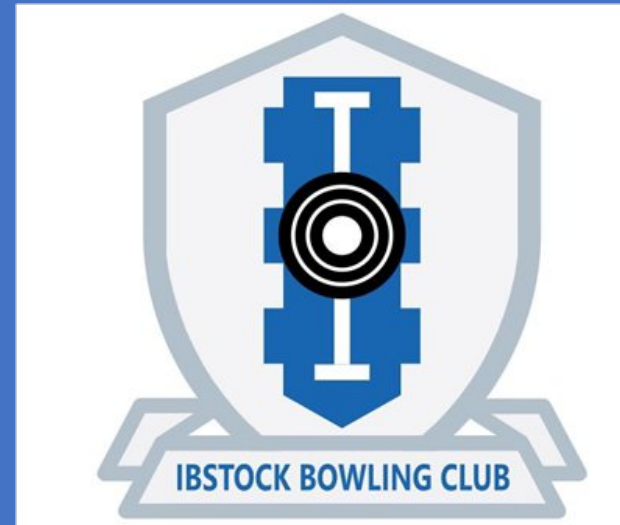

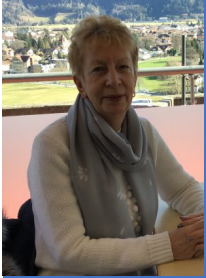

The Presidents Welcome

One moment I am writing to welcome you to the forthcoming season, the next I am congratulating you on our successes over the past season and focussing on the new season!

From a playing perspective, we achieved as well as the previous season, despite the club losing some significant playing experience. So we can all be proud of winning the Hinckley KO Trophy as well as the Coalville Over 60s league.

The green played remarkably well considering the loss of top dressing through copious rain in October/November, further impacted by the restricted access enforced by the Parish council locking up the welfare site and then the prolonged drought throughout the season. Many other clubs suffered far worse than ourselves with their greens not holding up and playing as well as ours.

Of course there was the marvellous Charity Gala day back in May, where the whole club showed the community that it does not just play bowls but aspires to help the community as a whole. Not many bowls clubs will get a mention in the House of Commons – a fact that we should all be justifiably proud!

We should also be proud of the grants awarded and the hard work of club members in completing, the recladding and insulating the rear of the club house, which looks incredibly smart. We have further plans to continue the refurbishment of the club house, funds allowing.

Registration 2026

The coming 2026 season registration for league and county competitions will be undertaken through the on-line 'MATCH' system. The league assumes that all players who played last year, will want to be registered to play for the following season AND for the same club. On this basis the club will be invoiced for registration fees for each of these players.

THEREFORE, the club needs to ensure that any player who is NOT playing for the club in 2026 is removed from that list of players held on line. Further the club needs to ensure that any new players are transferred to Ibstock, from their old club or, if completely new to bowling, need to be registered for the first time.

For this reason, our club secretary (i.e. Neil!) needs to be aware if you do not intend to play in 2026 (by the end of February) otherwise the club will be invoiced incorrectly.

The second aspect of this is that as entries into county competition are also carried out through the MATCH system, then players who wish to enter a county competition will need to be registered for their correct club, for this to happen successfully.

So don't delay in letting me now you don't intend to play in 2026 for Ibstock or even if you are undecided so that I can get the club registrations in order. Thanks!!

Hinckley & District Triples League.

Coalville and District Triples Leagues.

We entered three teams into the Coalville & District Triples leagues, which posed a challenge to field full sides, as the season evolved.

Ibstock A performed very well in finishing runners up to New Lount A in Division 1. A strong end to the season, when player numbers were more often than not a 'bare nine', pushed New Lount A up to the last game of the season.

Sadly, Ibstock B saw relegation into Division 2, which affords them the opportunity to rebuild for next year.

Ibstock C finished bottom of Division 3, but I am sure that the memory of victory by one shot, in the very last match of the season against Ashby C, will keep them keen over the winter period.

Coalville and District Over 60's Triples Leagues.

The 'Pensioners' league remains the longest season, not finishing until the last week in August.

Ibstock A led the league for most of the season, but were kept 'honest' by Market Bosworth who consistently won 8-0 as they caught up on their games. However, Ibstock A went into the final match needing just 2 points for the title, which was achieved with a comfortably 6-2 win.

Ibstock B finished in a comfortable mid table position, a good platform from which to launch their 2026 campaign and seek promotion to Division 1.
